Fraud, Phishing, and Scams Some members recently received a text message from "Pastor Jennifer." Do not reply. The message did not come from Rev. Jennifer. The phone number was not hers, either. These texts are another example of phishing, where a company tries to "hook" responses by imitating a known person or group. Responses to these messages will be followed by requests for money, often under the guise of asking for help. No requests for money will come from the ministers in this way. Again, do not reply.

And a reminder to carefully review emails before clicking on links or downloading attachments. When in doubt, delete and mark as spam. The Federal Trade Commission has a <u>helpful</u> <u>article here</u> on how to recognize and avoid phishing scams. Unfortunately, there are many scams running at this time while we are staying at home. If you receive suspicious emails or messages that may appear to come from the ministers or the church, please contact Revs. Jennifer or Patrick and the office. **Beyond Our Walls** In the months of March and April, members and friends donated \$2155 in support of the Northern Illinois Food Bank.
