• Since 2017, 170 police officers have been trained through Crisis Intervention to identify and de-escalate encounters with people suffering from mental illness or addiction


 \cdot Expanded and increased availability of a Crisis Stabilization Units offering people treatment instead of incarceration

 \cdot Helped create a Kane County Jail re-entry program linking ex-offenders with mental illness with appropriate treatment and housing

 \cdot Won 48 units of permanent supportive affordable housing units in Elgin

 \cdot Convinced law enforcement in the county to leverage their purchasing power to force gun manufacturers to create gun safety technologies
