During the past 5 years, UUSG has been part of these successes:

 \cdot Since 2017, 170 police officers have been trained through Crisis Intervention to identify and de-escalate encounters with people suffering from mental illness or addiction

 \cdot Expanded and increased availability of a Crisis Stabilization Units offering people treatment instead of incarceration

 \cdot Helped create a Kane County Jail re-entry program linking ex-offenders with mental illness with appropriate treatment and housing

 \cdot Won 48 units of permanent supportive affordable housing units in Elgin

 \cdot Convinced law enforcement in the county to leverage their purchasing power to force gun manufacturers to create gun safety technologies

Illinois Voter Information:

Voter Registration Illinois Voters may register online through October 18, at <u>ova.elections.il.gov/</u>. Voters may register in person after that date at polling places, but they must be prepared to vote immediately after registering.

Voting by Mail Kane County has already mailed applications for Voting By Mail. Whether or not you have received one, if you are registered to vote you can request a Vote by Mail ballot online at <u>kanecountyclerk.org/Elections</u>. Ballots will be sent out Thursday, September 24. Returning your ballot as soon as possible is recommended so that the county is not overwhelmed with counting paper ballots returned at the last minute. Ballots must be postmarked no later than November 3.

Voting in Person Polling places are required to take extra precautions to ensure the health and safety of voters and poll workers. Early voting begins September 24, at the County Clerk's office or at the Aurora Satellite office.

Early voting at other early voting locations begins October 19 and extends through November 2.

Student Judges November 3 is an election day so High School Juniors and Seniors who are at least 16 years old can be trained to serve as judges. See <u>kanecountyclerk.org/Elections/Pages/Student-Judges.aspx</u>.
