December Beyond Our Walls: Mutual Ground Shelter The vision of Mutual Ground Shelter in Aurora is to create a society free of domestic and sexual violence by providing education, awareness, and life-changing services that empower individuals, families, and communities to end the cycles of domestic and sexual violence in Kane and Kendall Counties. They provide counseling, advocacy, education, and shelter, as well as a 24/7 hotline. Their work is threatened by deep budget cuts from the State of Illinois. Beware the Scam Emails: There is another round of scam emails hitting hundreds of UU congregations. The most important warning we can give you is that UUSG Staff will never ask you to send money directly to any of us. Any email, text, or phone call making such a request is fake.

In addition, please <u>consider adding two-factor authentication</u> to your accounts if you haven't already.

Unfortunately, these steps can't fully stop bad actors from creating fake email accounts using email relationships that can be grabbed from various sources regardless of how secure we keep our accounts. Hackers are getting more sophisticated every day. The best defense is to pause and look for warning signs before responding to any unsolicited email, especially if something feels "off" or "weird" about the message.
