Action Alert: One of the goals listed in Geneva's Strategic Plan is to create more affordable housing in order to meet the state mandate and to provide for retiring seniors, young families starting out, and low-paid essential workers employed by schools, hospitals, and the government. A plan for a development of "Emma's Landing" affordable townhomes has been approved by Geneva's zoning commission for surplus city-owned property on Lewis Road. The plan will be discussed at a Geneva City Council Meeting of the Whole at 7pm on February 22. The opposition has been very vocal. It is essential that your alderperson hears from you.
