The July BOW cause is the Interfaith Community for Detained Immigrants ICDI provides a number of essential services for immigrants and asylumseekers, including:

- Offering housing, financial assistance, and case management to people who would otherwise have been detained in traumatizing conditions
- Providing support to immigrants being held in ICE detention in county jails
- Accompanying immigrants in court and serve as observers to hold the Immigration Court system accountable
- · Visiting migrant children apprehended by the US Government for crossing the border who are awaiting reunification with a family member.
