The July BOW cause is the Interfaith Community for Detained Immigrants

ICDI provides a number of essential services for immigrants and asylum-seekers, including:

- Offering housing, financial assistance, and case management to people who would otherwise have been detained in traumatizing conditions
- Providing support to immigrants being held in ICE detention in county jails
- Accompanying immigrants in court and serve as observers to hold the Immigration Court system accountable
- Visiting migrant children apprehended by the US Government for crossing the border who are awaiting reunification with a family member.

Religious Education News

Volunteers Needed for Youth Programs Religious education (RE) volunteers needed! Please help UU youth by volunteering your time and talents in any of the following ways:

Teachers For the 2021-22 school year, we are shifting to a middle hour RE program, so no more missing the church service (we continue to offer two services, before and after RE). Every classroom has two teachers, typically teaching twice per month. Everything you need is provided, including on-the-job training. You can start as the assistant teacher until you get to know the ropes. Grade levels of need include K-2 and 3-5. Number needed: 4 for a bi-weekly commitment

Arts & Exploration (A&E) Volunteers For our kids in K-5 who are unable to sit through an hour of church, we will offer A&E. This program will provide parents with their usual time to themselves during the service while providing the youth with social engagement. Ideas include play outside, go on a scavenger hunt, make a craft, do a puzzle, play a game, and more. Number needed: 8 for a monthly commitment

Substitute Teachers On occasion, one of our regular teachers may not be available or not feel well the morning of church. In that case, we need a list of volunteers to call upon. Once a background check has been completed, your name can be part of this list. Number needed: 6

Nursery Care Employees Upon reopening, we will need two nursery workers to be present for the duration of Sunday mornings. This is a paid position and ideally one of these people will be a consistent face in our nursery each week. The minimum age is 18 years. We're delighted to announce that Sister Suppers are back! Modeled on the traditional UU Circle Suppers, Sister Suppers are social gatherings for members and friends of UUSG who identify as women. They provide wonderful opportunities for connecting and reconnecting with other women within our church family.

Sister Suppers are held in the fall. One person serves as the hostess, and each participant brings an item, generally an entrée, a vegetable, dessert, etc., but the menu is flexible. You can sign up as a participant or as an alternate who will be called if last-minute openings occur. You can participate in one each month, or only in months you choose. The hostess establishes the exact date of her Supper. You do not have to host to participate. There will be a few modifications to protect the health and safety of everyone:

- Three Suppers rather than four will be offered.
- Attendance will be limited to six.
- You must have had a COVID-19 vaccine to participate.
