The Re-opening Task Force and the Board of Directors are BEYOND ELATED to announce that the building will be re-opening for in-person meetings in the Common Room on Thursday, July 1st! <u>Please use the Room Reservation Form here</u>. There are a few guidelines that we all must abide by for the safety of our staff.

- Mask wearing is mandatory.
- Building usage is restricted to the Common Room.
- No food or drink consumption is allowed.
- The restroom closest to the kitchen is designated as the "Visitor Restroom" and the ONLY bathroom that should be used by any non-staff members
- Cleaning supplies will be clearly visible in the Common Room. It is necessary to wipe down all "used" surfaces after use.

Please, please, please abide by these guidelines; all of us want to be together but we need to keep in mind that the safety of our staff and congregants is of the utmost importance and our #1 concern. Also, please remember that this is different than having in-person services, those are still online for now.

Beyond Our Walls for June: Youth Outlook The June Beyond Our Walls offering is going to support Youth Outlook which is the first social service agency in Illinois solely dedicated to the support of LGBTQ youth. They work in six counties in the Chicago suburbs, offering drop-in centers for youth, support for parents, and community education. A number of new centers have been added in our region this year. UUSG has proudly supported this work for years and Youth Outlook has grown with our help.
