It can be argued that there is an inspirational connection between early Christian martyrdom and the freedom fighters of the Civil Rights Movement. A question now lies before many: "for what cause could and would we lay down our lives for in this time and in this place?" This service offers a reflection on these sentiments and inspirations. Verdis LeVar Robinson (He/Him) is the Lenora Montgomery Scholar of Excellence at Meadville Lombard Theological School in Chicago, where he is an Aspirant for the Unitarian Universalist ministry and a candidate for the Master of Divinity. Verdis holds a BM in Voice Performance from Boston University; a BS Cum Laude and an MA in History from SUNY College at Brockport; and an MA in African American Studies from SUNY University at Buffalo. He currently serves as the ministerial intern for the Unitarian Church of Montpelier in Vermont.

August Beyond Our Walls Hesed House in Aurora is a national model for ending homelessness – one person, one family at a time. They are the secondlargest homeless shelter in the State of Illinois, and the largest shelter outside of the city of Chicago. The culmination of nearly three decades of strategic evolution. Their highly skilled professionals collaborate to provide the tools necessary to help individuals and families break free of the shackles binding them to homelessness. With the help of professional staff, alliances with outside agencies over a thousand people are served through Hesed House's shelter and three housing programs annually. At their Comprehensive Homeless Resource Center, people receive support related to housing, support systems, life skills, legal issues, physical/emotional abuse, mental/physical health, and much more.

New UUSG Adult Workshop: Assertion Training Group, led by UUSG Member, Richard E. "DJ" Jensen, PhD, retired clinical psychologist. This 9 or 10 series of classes will be offered in the Fall and Spring, with a weekly meeting time of 7-8:30pm at UUSG. Specific dates TBD. The goal of Assertion Training is to acquire and enhance the ability to speak up for ourselves, to make known our preferences, and develop our ability to minimize verbal aggression from others while enhancing our feelings of personal confidence and comfort in interpersonal situations. Participation involves expressing our personal needs and preferences in a variety of situations. Participants will learn to analyze interpersonal situations and to understand the needs presented in a variety of different situations. Participants are involved in role-playing interactions similar to everyday life. This provides useful experience for the personal interactions of everyday life. Alternative assertions (different ways of saying it) are always welcome and group members will be called upon to help one another by playing roles needed to develop the skills of positive assertion. Religious Education News

Volunteers Needed for Youth Programs Religious education (RE) volunteers needed! Please help UU youth by volunteering your time and talents in any of the following ways:

Teachers For the 2021-22 school year, we are shifting to a middle hour RE program, so no more missing the church service (we continue to offer two services, before and after RE). Every classroom has two teachers, typically teaching twice per month. Everything you need is provided, including on-the-job training. You can start as the assistant teacher until you get to know the ropes. Grade levels of need include K-2 and 3-5. Number needed: 4 for a biweekly commitment

Arts & Exploration (A&E) Volunteers For our kids in K-5 who are unable to sit through an hour of church, we will offer A&E. This program will provide parents with their usual time to themselves during the service while providing the youth with social engagement. Ideas include play outside, go on a scavenger hunt, make a craft, do a puzzle, play a game, and more. Number needed: 8 for a monthly commitment

Substitute Teachers On occasion, one of our regular teachers may not be available or not feel well the morning of church. In that case, we need a list of volunteers to call upon. Once a background check has been completed, your name can be part of this list. Number needed: 6

Nursery Care Employees Upon reopening, we will need two nursery workers to be present for the duration of Sunday mornings. This is a paid position and ideally one of these people will be a consistent face in our nursery each week. The minimum age is 18 years. If you or anyone you know may be interested, please pass this on. The pay is \$13/hour. Job Description and further details can be found here.

UUSG Re-Opening: Let's Get This Party Started!!

Homecoming is around the corner, and we are all excited to, once again, be together in our wonderful church building and seeing everyone in person.

To make that happen safely, smoothly, and inclusively, the Re-Opening Task Force is monitoring the news and the environment (the delta variant, potential return of mask mandates, the everchanging number of positive cases in our county) and while all of that will influence our final plans, right now... we are all systems GO!

In early August, the Task Force will meet to discuss the essential elements of the re-opening to be sure they are receiving the needed attention, including music, religious education, and of course, our Homecoming picnic. This is a work in progress, and we appreciate your understanding.

Here's what we do know:

Homecoming Sunday, September 12, is happening! There will be a worship service! There will be a picnic in Wheeler Park! More details soon. Attending the Sunday morning services remotely will continue to be an option into the foreseeable future. The Board has committed to a big technology upgrade that will keep our "hybrid" worship services inclusive, interactive, and high-quality.

Religious education programming will begin on Homecoming Sunday! The Facilities Team, Rev. Scot, and other church members are working towards a Sanctuary refresh that will maintain our historic charm and provide an updated look.

Following guidance from the UUA, CDC, Chicago Public Schools, WHO, and others, face masks will be required in the building for everyone. We are so grateful that a large percentage of our congregation are vaccinated, but we know that those under 12 are not yet even eligible to receive a vaccination, and more, that there are members and guests who are not fully vaccinated. For now, we are asking that everyone mask up, regardless of their vaccination status, to help us welcome everyone safely.
