# Announcements

**Our guest speaker today is the Rev. Michael Dowd.** Since April 2002, Michael and his wife (UU science writer and fellow climate activist Connie Barlow) have traveled North America delivering talks in some 500 UU congregations, summer camps, and minister retreats, as well as for other religious and secular groups. Their pro-science, pro-future ministry was featured as the cover story of our national membership magazine, UU World, in the spring of 2006. They've also been featured in major media throughout the U.S. and Canada, and Michael and Connie were honored as 2016 "UU Religious Humanists of the Year" at General Assembly in Columbus, Ohio.

Michael will engage in a discussion of his 25-minute video presentation, "Serenity Prayer for the 21st Century: Pro-Future Love-in-Action," which you are invited to watch between now and then. That program expands on content in his two TEDx talks and his book, Thank God for Evolution, which was endorsed by 6 Nobel Prize-winning scientists, noted skeptics, and by religious leaders across the spectrum. Date is TBA.

**September Beyond Our Walls: Lazarus House** At a time when we are celebrating homecoming, we remember people who have no home to which they can return. Three hundred of our neighbors are being served currently, and they need our help. The first Saturday of each month volunteers from UUSG provide lunches, dinners, and stay overnight. Families have found that it is a great project to prepare 17 sack lunches. Others fix a casserole and salad for 12. And now once again we need a volunteer who will stay overnight in a separate room and be available to assist the staff member in an emergency. Half will go directly to meet the needs of the shelter, and half will replenish our funds to reimburse UUSG chefs or provide meals. <u>Please give generously here</u>.

Participants will learn to analyze interpersonal situations and to understand the needs presented in a variety of different situations. Participants are engaged in role-playing interactions similar to everyday life. This provides useful experience for the personal interactions of everyday life. Alternative assertions (different ways of saying it) are always welcomed and needed, and group members are called upon to help one another by playing roles needed to develop the skills of positive assertion. "We Two Alone," by Jack Wang. A young boy jeopardizes his life to play hockey in 1920s Canada. A couple is caught in Shanghai in the midst of war. An actor in New York tries to keep his career afloat while his relationship crumbles. Threaded throughout these poignant short stories is the Chinese immigrant experience, as Wang paints a picture of life in diaspora throughout time. Capturing hope, pain, and sacrifice, these stories weave a story of those who journey into the unknown.
