UUSG Sanctuary décor

To add visual energy to our Sanctuary, it has been lovingly updated by the facilities and technology teams.

The fabric for the banners was designed by <u>Cecilia Mok</u>, an artist and surface designer in Sydney, Australia. The fabric was printed by <u>Spoonflower</u>, a waste-free, print-ondemand service using non-toxic inks and sustainable fabrics. These banners are changeable and can be updated by season or theme. We envision building a portfolio of banners that can be rotated to keep the sanctuary inspiring and beautiful.

The acoustic gray tiles on the west wall are made of recycled plastic by <u>Feltright</u>. They're arranged in a diamond pattern to echo the pattern in our painted windows and pew fabric.

The sanctuary walls and wainscoting have been painted. The wainscoting color remains White Dove. The wall color was changed to Revere Pewter, a soft, gray-beige.

The maroon curtain on the front wall has been taken down, while the white curtain remains. Curtain rings and wands were added to the white curtain, making it easy to close and open.

Some other items of note: two air purifiers were assembled and placed in the sanctuary, several electrical outlets were replaced with child tamper-proof outlets, and a small banner was made for the pulpit.
