Thanksgiving Pie & Fellowship Rev. Scot is preaching at the Geneva Lutheran Church **tonight at 6 PM**. There will be loads of pie! Details at <u>uusg.org</u>.

Our November BOW offering will again go to **Veterans Path to Hope**. Veterans from WWII up to our present conflicts have successfully participated in Veterans Path to Hope services and have found employment, reconnected with their communities, and rejoined their families. Their programs are staffed by veterans and veteran-friendly individuals who have knowledge of the challenges that face veterans and demonstrate an individualized approach to each concern. This organization has transformed lives through its work with veterans in our part of Illinois.

The Mental Health Ministry will be giving a presentation on death by suicide and suicide prevention on Sunday, December 4, at 12 PM in the Common Room. Roxanne Willis will give a short presentation on the statistics related to suicide, the specific groups at risk, how to tell if someone needs immediate help, and what we can do as individuals and communities both to understand and to prevent death by suicide. After the presentation, we will open the floor for discussion of this difficult but important topic.

The Aurora Soup Kitchen (aka The Sandwich Board)

serves mostly homeless and indigent persons in Aurora and surrounding communities. Due to Covid, sack lunches replaced a hot meal prepared in their kitchen. The need has grown from approximately 30 lunches to 220 lunches per week. UUSG is one of many surrounding churches who pitch in to meet this growing need and we are very grateful to those of you who provide bottled water, cookies, snack bars, and fruit. There is also a growing need for winter clothing: coats, jackets, sweaters, socks, mittens, hats, and scarves. All sizes are needed. If you have any of these items - new or gently used please, you may drop them off at UUSG in the volunteer office by December 15. Thank you for your consideration of this worthy cause.
