UUSG Re-Opening: Let's Get This Party Started!

Homecoming is around the corner, and we are all excited to, once again, be together in our wonderful church building and seeing everyone in person.

To make that happen safely, smoothly, and inclusively, the Re-Opening Task Force is monitoring the news and the environment (the delta variant, potential return of mask mandates, the everchanging number of positive cases in our county), and while all of that will influence our final plans, right now... we are all systems GO!

In early August, the Task Force will meet to discuss the essential elements of the re-opening to be sure they are receiving the needed attention, including music, religious education, and of course, our Homecoming picnic.

Here's what we do know:

- 1. Homecoming Sunday, September 12, is happening! There will be a worship service! There will be a picnic in Wheeler Park! More details soon.
- Attending the Sunday morning services remotely will continue to be an option into the foreseeable future. The Board has committed to a big technology upgrade that will keep our "hybrid" worship services inclusive, interactive, and high-quality.
- 3. Religious education programming will begin on Homecoming Sunday!
- 4. The Facilities Team, Rev. Scot, and other church members are working towards a Sanctuary refresh that will maintain our historic

- charm and provide an updated look.
- 5. Following guidance from the UUA, CDC, Chicago Public Schools, WHO, and others, face masks will be required in the building for everyone. We are so grateful that a large percentage of our congregation are vaccinated, but we know that those under 12 are not yet even eligible to receive a vaccination, and more, that there are members and guests who are not fully vaccinated. For now, we are asking that everyone mask up, regardless of their vaccination status, to help us welcome everyone safely.



Volunteers Needed for Youth Programs

As we approach Homecoming Sunday on September 12 with excitement and cautious optimism, we have numerous critical roles to fill to meet the needs of our youth. Please help UU youth by volunteering your time and talents in any of the following ways:

Teachers

For the 2021-22 school year, we are shifting to a middle hour RE program, so no more missing the church service (we continue to offer two services, before and after RE). Every classroom has two teachers, typically teaching twice per month. Everything you need is provided, from curriculum to on-the-job training. You can start as the assistant teacher until you get to know the ropes. Grade levels of need include K-2, 3-5 and middle school.

Number needed: 2 for a bi-weekly commitment

Arts & Exploration (A&E) Volunteers

For our kids in K-5 who are unable to sit through an hour of church, we will offer A&E. This program will provide parents with their usual time to themselves during the service while providing the youth with social engagement. Ideas include play outside, go on a scavenger hunt, make a craft, do a puzzle, play a game and more. Further details can be found here.

Number needed: 6 people to offer a once per month commitment

Substitute Teachers

On occasion, one of our regular teachers may not be available or not feel well the morning of church. In that case, we need a list of volunteers to call upon. Once a background check has been completed, your name can be part of this list.

Number needed: 6

Nursery Care Employees

Upon reopening, we will need two nursery workers to be present for the duration of Sunday mornings. This is a paid position and ideally one of these people will be a consistent face in our nursery each week. The minimum age is 18 years. If you or anyone you know may be interested, please pass this on. The pay is \$13/hour. Job Description and further details can be found here.

We capped July with the return of our talented UUSG Choir, plus exceptional piano pieces played by Angela Salvaggione. And she accompanied Cynthia, who introduced two hymns she'll be teaching us all in person later in the church year. In addition, Cynthia played her own

arrangement of a piano piece, and later provided not only vocals but simultaneously accompanied herself on recorder thanks to Zoom magic.



Our House - Sanctuary Refresh

In August, several members of the Facilities and Technology Teams, along with other volunteers, will be refreshing the sanctuary. The goal is to have a renewed, welcoming sanctuary completed by the time in-person services are conducted again. The Reopening Taskforce and Board of Directors will reassess our re-opening plans in August.

The budget for this year included funding to install technology to "live stream" our in-person services. As a result, the Technology Team will be installing video equipment to broadcast and record "live" services, similar to our current Zoom services.

Also, a team of volunteers from the Facilities Team will paint the walls and wainscotting. This team will be led by Sean Hruby, one of our members and a professional painting contractor. It is time to repaint the sanctuary's interior since it was last painted 12 years ago.

Lastly, Rev. Scot requested that we add more color to the sanctuary to provide more visual interest and energy. We'll accomplish this by adding colorful banners that are easy to change as needed.

Our plans have been endorsed by the Board and the Heritage Team, and we are busy working on the details. More to come next month!

Take Action to tell the St. Charles School Board that you support Culturally Responsive Instruction


School districts in Illinois are receiving pressure from individuals who

All styrofoam must be in bags (not in individual pieces) with food service styrofoam and packaging styrofoam in different bags. Food packaging must be washed or we will not be able to accept it, and it will go in the garbage bins. We take all contributions to the Dart recycling pick-up in North Aurora each month.

Beyond Our Walls for August: Hesed House

Hesed House is a national model for ending homelessness – one person, one family at a time. They are the second-largest homeless shelter in the

State of Illinois, and the largest shelter outside of the city of Chicago. The culmination of nearly three decades of strategic evolution.

Their highly skilled professionals collaborate to provide the tools necessary to help individuals and families break free of the shackles binding them to homelessness. With the help of professional staff, alliances with outside agencies over a thousand people are served through Hesed House's shelter and three housing programs annually. At their Comprehensive Homeless Resource Center, people receive support related to housing, support systems, life skills, legal issues, physical/emotional abuse, mental/physical health, and much more.


Building Now Open for In-Person Meetings
